










Rosewood Luang Prabang



Siem Reap is home to roughly 90,000 people and is the commercial hub for exploring Angkor Wat, one of the Wonders of the World. The name Siem Reap literally means 'Siamese defeated', in reference to the Khmers reclaiming the territory from Siam, who conquered the kingdom in 1431. Full control was not back in Khmer hands (under French rule) until 1864.








Shinta Mani Angkor & Bensley Collection Pool Villa


Day 9 • December 6






Cities are often defined by their skylines or landmarks, but if there was ever a city that screamed out to be defined by its experiences and its assault on the senses, it's Bangkok.
